**Course Description: AH WWII through Present (1930-Present)**

This course will stress the important social, political, military, and economic achievements of earlier generations of Americans. Students will examine and analyze the events of the past as a bridge to understanding the events of today and the future. The course will explore the events leading up to World War II beginning in the early 1930's, how the United States became involved in the war, and the process of the US developing into a "Superpower." The course will then follow the United States and its history through the end of the World War II, leading into major events of the 1950's, 1960's, 1970's, through the present day. The Holocaust, role of minorities, women's rights, and the Civil Rights Movement will be studied. **American History classes can be taken in any order. STUDENTS MUST TAKE AT LEAST 2 SEMESTERS OF AMERICAN HISTORY**

**Textbook:** The Americans, Units 7-9, Chapters 24-34 will be used in the classroom. Extra copies will be available for individual check out as needed.

**Grading Information:** Approximately 800 points are possible during the semester.

**Make-up Assignment Procedure:** If you are absent... it is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to meet with me the first day you are back from your absence.
