## Course Description: AH Reconstruction through New Deal (1865-1940)

This course will stress the important social, political, military, and economic achievements of earlier generations of Americans. Students will examine and analyze the events of the past as a bridge to understanding the events of today and the future. The course will begin with the study of Civil War issues, the settlement of the Great Plains, and the changes brought about by industrialization, immigration, and the rise of big business in the U.S. The course continues with a study of the emergence of the U.S. as a world power through the topics of imperialism, the Spanish American War, and WWI. Finally, the events surrounding progressivism, the roaring '20s, the Great Depression, and the New Deal are studied. **American History classes can be taken in any order. STUDENTS NEED AT LEAST 2 SEMESTERS OF AMERICAN HISTORY TO GRADUATE.**

**Textbook:** The Americans, Units 7-9, Chapters 24-34 will be used in the classroom and posted in Google Classroom. Extra copies will be available for individual check out as needed.

**Grading Information:** Approximately 800 points are possible during the semester.


